#### **Measurable Objective 1:**

100% of All Students will increase student growth by 10% in elementary and secondary science as shown on scores and gains on science teachers' semester exams n Science by 06/15/2017 as measured by M-STEP and NWEA.

#### Strategy 1:

'roject based, explicit instruction - Our elementary science teachers will identify projects that foster increased learning opportunities for students to better comprehend und recall key concepts, principles, and skills in biology, chemistry, and physics. Teachers will be given time and support to develop new enriched curriculum around he new state standards in science. For example, they are currently planning a "growing and gardening" project with an emphasis on students' reading, writing, planning and experimenting with plant life--focusing on light, temperature, weather, nutrients, plant protection, etc as a focal point for improved science thinking, reading and vriting.

At the secondary level, our science teachers are setting up and equipping a new science lab for a new series of experiments for students chemistry and physics earning, emphasizing their scientific observation, reasoning, and scientific writing skills.
