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Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Croswell-Lexington High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

The high school has continued to incorporate college readiness benchmarks into the curriculum, as well as merging key Common Core Standards with Michigan Merit Curriculum benchmarks. CLHS has also been vigorously working on preparing our students for the PSAT/SAT assessments used to test college readiness levels. Teachers have been working on using data to drive instruction through formative and summative assessment tools, which allow for opportunities to re-teach lessons and identify key benchmarks that need more focused instruction.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Croswell-Lexington High School partners with St. Clair County Community College and other colleges offering courses as Dual Enrollment. Students can choose to count courses for both high school and college credit or just college credit. Cros-Lex High School also partners with the Sanilac ISD for students to take Career Center courses.

CLHS offered five (5) Advanced Placement (AP) courses during the 2023-24 school year including Calculus, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, U.S. History, and Physics.

- c. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB)

2021-2022: 81 out of 428 (grades 10, 11, & 12) or 19%

2022-2023: 59 out of 402 (grades 10, 11, & 12) or 15%

2023-2024: 78 out of 372 (grades 10, 11, & 12) or 21%

d. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE
LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT

2021-2022: *24 students or 56% of students taking an AP exam earned a passing score*

2022-2023: *61 students or 54% of students taking an AP exam earned a passing score*

2023-2024: *54 students or 68% of students taking an AP exam earned a passing score*
