Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-2024 educational progress for Pioneer High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-2024. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-2022. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Pioneer High School has not been given one of these labels.

Pioneer High School supports entering students to meet graduation requirements. The program includes online learning and tutoring to help students complete academic requirements. Assessments are given to aid in identifying areas of concern so that instruction can be adjusted to meet individual needs.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are selected to attend Pioneer High School by having an identified academic need or requiring additional support beyond the traditional middle and high school settings. Students may also be selected for Pioneer High School based on a nontraditional schedule and a need to take virtual classes.
