2022-23 Educational Goals

All teachers will use a variety of strategies and assessments to support meaningful student progress towards mastery of reading/ELA academic standards. In reading/ELA, results from benchmark and local assessments will be continuously discussed and analyzed by staff.

Goal 2: By the end of the 2022-23 school year, each school and the district will show growth in mathematics achievement throughout the global pandemic as measured on NWEA Map Growth for Grade K-8 and local assessments for Grade 9-12.

All teachers will use a variety of strategies and assessments to support meaningful student progress towards mastery of math academic standards. In math, results from benchmark and local assessments will be continuously discussed and analyzed by staff.



Progress Towards Academic Goals

Highlights:

Fall 2022 data showed that although many students are below the grade level norm, students who attend ECS for a Full Academic Year are showing growth.

Our local assessment data shows a strong correlation between attendance and student achievement and that more Kindergarteners are coming to school ready to learn.

The Winter NWEA assessment window just closed - there is observable growth in Reading and Math - especially in Grades Kindergarten through 5.

Some things we currently have in place to address gaps:

- Curriculum implementation i-Ready Math K-8
- Literacy Footprints for differentiated guided reading K-5
- High Dosage Tutoring in Math and Reading for targeted students grades 1-3
- Continued teacher collaboration and Multi-tiered systems of support provide Tier 2 and 3 interventions to students
- Instructional Coaching Cycles in Reading and Math Close Reading, Writing, Vocabulary and Problem Solving



- Curriculum Adoption process to purchase high quality curricular resources for ELA K-12 and Math Grades 9-12
- High quality professional development for administrators, teachers and support staff
- Individual schools will report at upcoming BOE meetings
- Spring Benchmark Assessment Data in June 2023 include Fall to Spring growth
- Monitor progress towards goals at all levels during Performance Management, District Turnaround Network, PLCs, etc.
- Develop action plans based on our Strategic Plan
