**RE:** **Resolution to Consider Approval of Reconfirmation of the Plymouth-Canton Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (First and Final Reading)**

---

**Recommended Resolution**

It was moved by Member Kehoe and seconded by Member Brooks to reconfirm the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan that was approved on September 29, 2020. This plan recommends that students continue to receive instruction through two distinct models: (1) The P-CCS Virtual Academy, a 100% virtual model, and (2) Safe Start Remote Learning with P-CCS, a model that began 100% virtually with a planned phase-in approach to in-person learning.

In Safe Start Remote Learning with P-CCS, all students in grades K-9 and high school specialized courses will receive in-person instruction through a hybrid model with a phased-in approach to full-day in-person learning for all students using the following timeline:

- **January 19:** All *Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students* in a hybrid model.
- **January 26:** All students in *6<sup>th</sup> grade, 9<sup>th</sup> grade, and high school specialized classes* in a hybrid model.
- **January 28:** **Starkweather Academy** students in identified courses in a hybrid model.
- **February 1:** All *7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade* students in a hybrid model.
- **February 17:** All *Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students* in a full five day per week in-person model.
- **February 18:** All *6<sup>th</sup> grade through 9<sup>th</sup> grade students, and students in high school specialized courses*, in a full four day per week in-person model; Wednesdays in February will remain virtual for students in grades 6-12.
- **March 1:** All *6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students* in a full five day per week in-person model.

Students in grades 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> will continue to receive instruction remotely until March 1, with opportunities for additional in-person support for students with academic and social-emotional needs.

- **March 1:** All *10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students* return to in-person learning (either in a hybrid or fully in-person model, TBD). Students in **high school specialized courses** will transition to full days consistent with the agreed-upon timeline.

If necessary, based on the review of school, district, community, and county metrics and in consultation with the local health department, the district may pause in-person instruction for a specified period of time at a particular school, level, or districtwide.

This reconfirmation is a requirement of MCL 388.1698a of the State School Aid Act.


