**RE:** **Resolution to Consider Approval of Reconfirmation of the Plymouth-Canton Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (First and Final Reading)**

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**Recommended Resolution**

It was moved by Member Kehoe and seconded by Member Sidhu to reconfirm the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan that was approved on September 29, 2020. This plan recommends that students continue to receive instruction through two distinct models: (1) The P-CCS Virtual Academy, a 100% virtual model, and (2) Safe Start Remote Learning with P-CCS, a model that began 100% virtually with a planned phase-in approach to in-person learning:

- **March 1:** All ***Kindergarten through 5th grade Safe Start students*** begin a full five day per week in-person learning model.
- **March 1:** All ***6th, 7th, and 8th grade Safe Start students*** begin a full four day per week in-person model (Wednesdays will remain fully remote live instruction)
- **March 1:** All ***9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade Safe Start students*** return to in-person learning in a half-day hybrid model with Blue/Green Cohorts (Wednesdays will be fully remote live instruction for all *9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students during the month of March*)
- **March 1:** All ***Starkweather Academy Safe Start students*** return to a full five day per week in-person learning model.

Programming will remain remote for all students in the P-CCS Virtual Academy; however, schedules will need to shift to mirror the above plan.

If necessary, based on the review of school, district, community, and county metrics and in consultation with the local health department, the district may pause in-person instruction for a specified period of time at a particular school, level, or districtwide.

This reconfirmation is a requirement of MCL 388.1698a of the State School Aid Act.
