RE: **Resolution to Consider Approval of Reconfirmation of the Plymouth-Canton Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (First and Final Reading)**

Recommended Resolution


It was moved by Member Kehoe and seconded by Member Brooks to reconfirm the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan for the 2021-2022 school year. This plan recommends that students continue to receive instruction through two distinct models: (1) The P-CCS Virtual Academy, a 100% virtual model, and (2) In-person five full days per week.

- All **Pre-Kindergarten (Early Childhood) and IPSEP Programs** fully in-person
- All **Kindergarten through 12th grade students** in-person five full days per week
- **Madonna ASD Center-Based program / GOALS Post-secondary Program** in-person five full days per week
- **P-CCS Virtual Academy** option available at all levels five full days per week

If necessary, based on the review of school, district, community, and county metrics and in consultation with the local health department, the district may pause in-person instruction for a specified period of time at a particular school, level, or districtwide.


This reconfirmation is a requirement of MCL 388.1698a of the State School Aid Act.
