Finance

Mr. Chrencik reported he is working, with Danica Nowak, on the 2022-2023 schedule. The schedule looks to be able to support a full time Building/Constructions trades classroom. Mr. Chrencik received approval for the return of the CTE Construction trades program. The Class of 2022 Valedictorian is Josiah Hall and Salutatorian Joe Hoy. Josiah plans to enlist in the Navy with a focus on nuclear engineering and Joe plans to attend Central Michigan University to study mechanical engineering. Mr. Chrencik informed the board of the Otsego County RISE video starring Avery Huston, Kennedy Johnson, and Emma Shimel. He reported on the ongoing testing with SAT/PSAT, ACT Work keys, and NWEA all scheduled. Robotics attended another competition last weekend with several students attending as spectators to support their fellow students. Spring sports are off to a rough start with multiple cancellations due to weather but looking forward to successful seasons once the weather cooperates. Michigan Works is providing a resume writing seminar as well as mock interviews and a job fair.

Mrs. Odren and Mrs. Kievit reported that end of year activities and fieldtrips are moving forward. Everyone is looking forward to the return of these activities after a two-year hiatus. The Lewiston Greenhouse is providing walking tours and educational lessons to the Lewiston K-3 classrooms. It was reported that testing also continues throughout the K-8 classrooms. Staffing changes may be forthcoming once a decision is made on one or two Kindergarten classrooms and one or two first grade classrooms in the Lewiston building. The Johannesburg building will be looking to share the Building Trades staff member to provide an additional special class at the MS level. Mrs. Speerstra will be hosting a student teacher next year. Taylor Girardin, paraprofessional in Lewiston has published a book. Mrs. Kievit reported two Lewiston students will have their artwork displayed on the 2022 Lewiston Mushroom Festival pin.

WHEREAS:

- 1. The administration has recommended that a student whose identity is known to the Board (the "Student") be expelled for using a vape device and a dab device with THC.
- 2. School administrators notified the Student's parents of the specific charge underlying the discipline recommendation, as well as the date, time and place of the disciplinary hearing.
- 3. Pursuant to the request of the Student's parents, and as authorized by Section 8(b) of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.268(b), the disciplinary hearing was conducted in a closed session meeting of the Board.
- 4. The hearing afforded the Student and the Student's representatives an opportunity to respond to the charge and to present pertinent evidence for the Board's consideration.
- 5. The Board has carefully considered all of the evidence produced in this student discipline hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. A preponderance of the evidence establishes that on April 22, 2022, the Student using a vape device and a dab device the THC in violation of Section 3102 of the Student Code of Conduct.
- 2. Based on careful consideration of all of the following factors, the Board determines that expulsion is warranted:
 - The student's age;
 - · The student's disciplinary history;
 - Whether the student has a disability;
 - The seriousness of the behavior;
 - Whether the behavior posed a safety risk;
 - Whether restorative practices are a better option; and
 - Whether lesser interventions would address the behavior.
- 3. Consistent with Sections 11a and 1311(1) of the Revised School Code, the Board finds that the interests of the District are served by this resolution.
- 4. Administrators are directed and authorized to implement all terms of this resolution and are delegated all necessary authority to do so.
- 5. All resolutions and parts of resolutions that conflict with the provisions of this resolution are rescinded.

WHEREAS:

- 1. The administration has recommended that a student whose identity is known to the Board (the "Student") be expelled for using a dab device with THC and sharing it with another student.
- 2. School administrators notified the Student's parents of the specific charge underlying the discipline recommendation, as well as the date, time and place of the disciplinary hearing.
- 3. Pursuant to the request of the Student's parents, and as authorized by Section 8(b) of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, MCL 15.268(b), the disciplinary hearing was conducted in a closed session meeting of the Board.
- 4. The hearing afforded the Student and the Student's representatives an opportunity to respond to the charge and to present pertinent evidence for the Board's consideration.
- The Board has carefully considered all of the evidence produced in this student discipline hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- A preponderance of the evidence establishes that on April 22, 2022, the Student using a dab device with THC and sharing it with another student in violation of Section 3102 of the Student Code of Conduct.
- 2. Based on careful consideration of all of the following factors, the Board determines that expulsion is warranted:
 - The student's age;
 - The student's disciplinary history;
 - Whether the student has a disability;
 - The seriousness of the behavior;
 - Whether the behavior posed a safety risk;
 - Whether restorative practices are a better option; and
 - Whether lesser interventions would address the behavior.
- 3. The Student is suspended 180 school days, with the ability to apply for reinstatement in December of 2022 for a potential early reinstatement of the second semester of the 2022-2023 school year.
- 4. During the time of the expulsion, the Student may not be on school grounds or attend any functions at the District without prior written approval from the appropriate administrator.
- The Student may petition the Board for reinstatement no sooner than December 5, 2022. Before reinstatement, the Student must:
 - · demonstrate successful participation in an appropriate counseling program;
 - submit to the Board competent and credible evidence from and appropriately licensed and credentialed professional that the Student has a clean drug screening;
 - establish that the Student has not engaged in conduct during the period of expulsion that may be viewed by the Board as detrimental to the Student's continued education at the District;
 - demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the Student received educational instruction and cooperatively participated in an educational program during the period of expulsion;
- 6. Consistent with the Board's action taken this date, administrators shall promptly meet with the Student's parent/guardian to determine those appropriate educational services to which the Student may be entitled under state and federal law.
- 7. Consistent with Sections 11a and 1311(1) of the Revised School Code, the Board finds that the interests of the District are served by this resolution.
- 8. Administrators are directed and authorized to implement all terms of this resolution and are delegated all necessary authority to do so.
- All resolutions and parts of resolutions that conflict with the provisions of this resolution are rescinded.
