We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Bailey Early Childhood Center. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been identified for/given any of these labels.

Students at Bailey Early Childhood Center do not participate in state testing. We do use local assessments and teacher observations to measure student growth and help guide instruction. We will continue to utilize the local assessments and teacher observations to target students who may need additional assistance. Our goal as a school is to continue making progress with students and provide them with the support they need to be successful.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are assigned to Bailey Early Childhood Center based on residency within the district or through school-of-choice application. Various factors such as birthday, school readiness and needs are also taken into consideration when placing students at Bailey Early Childhood Center in Developmental Kindergarten or Early Childhood Special Education. Students who are placed in our Great Start Readiness Program are assigned to our building through the application process conducted by our local Intermediate School District.
