Achievement

Provide a narrative on progress toward meeting the goals outlined above.

By the end of the semester, 17% of <u>freshmen</u> students have failed courses which means 83% of our students passed 100% of their course work. A student who fails four or more courses is considered off track for grade promotion. (35 out of 197 failed a class)

By the end of the semester, 11% of <u>sophomore</u> students have failed courses which means 89% of our students passed 100% of their course work. A student who fails four or more courses is considered off track for grade promotion. (25 out of 222 failed a class)

By the end of the semester, 19% of <u>junior</u> students have failed courses which means 81% of our students passed 100% of their course work. A student who fails four or more courses is considered off track for grade promotion. (45 out of 232 failed a class)

By the end of the semester, 7% of <u>senior</u> students have failed courses which means 93% of our students passed 100% of their course work. A student who fails four or more courses at this course is considered off track for graduation. (14 out of 192 failed a class)

The high school has developed internal systems of support for at-risk students and has hired an additional counselor who works to track and meet with kids who need intervention.
