In-person learning has been shown to provide the greatest benefit to students, and ensuring this can happen consistently and safely during the upcoming school year has been deemed a priority for Berrien County Schools.

The 2021-2024 Return to Learn Plan provides detailed guidance to ensure that COVID-19 prevention and mitigation measures are implemented in a way that fosters optimal learning environments while simultaneously ensuring health and safety for students and staff in Berrien County. This plan was collaboratively developed by Berrien County Superintendents with the support of the Berrien County Health Department to ensure that all Berrien County School Districts have an aligned and detailed plan for a successful return to the classroom this fall.

The Lakeshore Board of Education appoints the Superintendent, or designee, as responsible for the day to day implementation of this plan, including any optional decisions within the plan.

This plan will be reviewed and ratified by the Lakeshore Board of Education during the regular monthly Board meeting.

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Student Illness

Parents/Guardians are not to send children to school who are ill per PO 8450 - Control of Casual Contact Communicable Diseases.

Students exhibiting the following symptoms shall remain home or excluded from school until the student is symptom free for 24 hours without the aid of medication.

- Fever (temp over 100.4) or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose (congestion)
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatique (tiredness)
- Vomiting and diarrhea

Students exhibiting the following symptoms which are strong indicators of COVID-19 shall remain home or excluded from school for 10 days unless a negative COVID-19 test result or a doctor's note stating the student may return to school is provided to school authorities.

- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell
