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#### Reed City Middle School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

February 3, 2025

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Reed City Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Ms. Stefanie Shoemaker, Principal, for assistance.

For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student sub group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is one in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school "HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS".

We believe in continuous improvement and have implemented a building wide multi-tiered system of support to address any student achievement that falls in the bottom 30% and achievement gaps of our students with disabilities. We will continue to focus on improving Tier I instruction, offering a variety of electives and providing additional levels of support through our Tier II and Tier III instruction for students not meeting their achievement goals. We are dedicated to developing a process to support students in a personalized manner and celebrating their success.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL: Reed City Middle School houses all of the district's 5th through 8th grade students. These students are assigned to this

building when they enroll into the district and live in the school district. Reed City Area Public Schools also offers School of Choice opportunities.

- 2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Reed City Middle School is currently implementing strategies/activities from their school improvement plan to meet the students' educational needs. The following school improvement goals have been developed as determined by data analysis.
  - All students will be proficient in reading.
  - All students will be proficient in writing.
  - All students will be proficient in mathematics.
  - All students will be proficient in social studies.
  - All students will increase their scientific literacy.
  - All students will increase their social/emotional awareness.

To assist with our five goals mentioned above, we continue to utilize our CPM Math Program for the eighth consecutive year. The program requirements have significantly increased student discussions revolving around multi-step mathematical problems. Our students are being asked to work in teams and problem solve on a daily basis. Our teachers follow a reading initiative that includes all students reading and showing comprehension. In addition, the CHAMPS program has been utilized by the majority of teachers to model expectations for our students. Our social studies and science classes continue to use citing evidence initiatives to increase writing interdisciplinary. We have developed a comprehensive technology curriculum required for all students. Furthermore, we have implemented a protocol that holds all students accountable for reading and have integrated developmental reading strategies in all classes in an effort to improve achievement. For advanced students, RCMS offers online courses for high school credit and accelerated math courses in 8th grade. We will address social/emotional needs by implementing a personal skills curriculum at all grade levels, and by utilizing concepts from the Capturing Kids' Hearts program.

Reed City Middle School staff will continue to analyze PSAT, M-STEP, NWEA, as well as formative and summative classroom assessment data to monitor whether instruction strategies are effective in improving student growth. A complete copy of the School Improvement Plan is located at the Reed City Middle School office.

- 3. SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS: Mecosta-Osceola ISD offers a variety of programs to educate students from age 0 to 26 with various handicapping conditions, which include: early childhood development delay, infants and toddlers with severe impairments, autism spectrum disorder, cognitive impairments and emotional impairments. Students also attend specialized programs in other districts within Mecosta County, as well as in other counties through contracted services. Eligible special education students are enrolled in the MOISD School through the Individualized Educational Planning Committee (IEPC) process. Each student's needs are discussed, using the 13 step least restrictive environment process as a guide, to determine appropriate program placement.
- 4. CORE CURRICULUM: As mandated by the State of Michigan, Reed City Area Public Schools has developed curriculum for the various subject areas. Learning goals to be achieved by all learners have been defined based upon the Michigan Academic Standards for

English language arts, mathematics, and literacy in history/social studies, science, and technical subjects. We are using Michigan's K-12 Science Standards (revised in 2017) and Michigan's K-12 Social Studies Standards (revised in 2019). Copies of our core curriculum are available in all buildings, at the district office, and on our website.

6. PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: In the fall of 2024, all parents (approximately 465) were encouraged to review their child's progress on our student reporting system known as Skyward and were invited to meet with teachers on a scheduled parent-teacher conference date in

October. Parents had an open block of time to come to the building to talk with teachers. As a result, 36% of our parents participated in conferences with teachers regarding the progress of their child. A winter parent-teacher conferences were hosted in January, and as a result, 25% of our parents participated in conferences with teachers regarding the progress of their child. There will also be a conference time scheduled in the spring.

The following was our fall PT conference attendance by grade level:

- 8th grade = 28 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 7th grade = 40 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 6th grade = 50 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 5th grade = 54 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported 172 total = 36%

The following was our winter PT conference attendance by grade level:

- 8th grade = 26 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 7th grade = 27 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 6th grade = 26 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported
- 5th grade = 38 students had parent(s)/guardian(s) who reported 117 total = 25%
